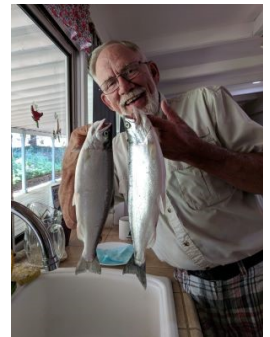
### FISHING
