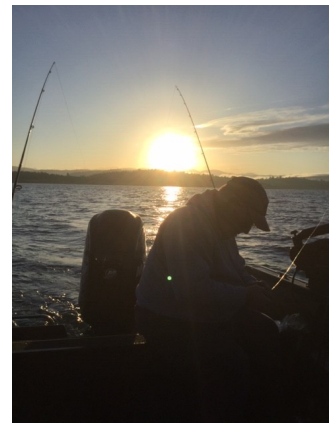
FISHING
