For those of you that attended our February luncheon our Little Sir brought in a great speaker, Steve Allen, Master Parachutist and wing walker. While his video may have been somewhat difficult to see from the far end of the room he was a very enthusiastic speaker with some great stories. Hopefully, that made up for our lack of a large video screen.

At our March luncheon Danny will be hosting Deputy Rob Lyons of the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Department who is also the Neighborhood Watch Program liaison to the volunteer (CSU) Community Service Unit of Tuolumne County. Sounds like we're in for another great speaker with some interesting stories.

Also, for our March luncheon will be having Corned Beef and Cabbage - an American and Irish favorite. As I mentioned at our February luncheon our caterer, Dino, will provide Baked Cod and Rice Pilaf for those of you that don't want the main entree. From the 'hands raised count' at the previous luncheon Dino will only have 25 of these fish entrees. So if you weren't included in the 'count' or didn't call me your only other choice is to purchase 'salad only' - which is also available.

For our upcoming Ladies Day Luncheon Danny has put together a great menu (see his Little Sir Notes). Additionally, our Branch Executive Committee will be contributing Shrimp Cocktails and Pub Snacks at no additional cost to the attendees. All this, along with music, dancing and a large prize drawing for only \$23 per person. Also, we will have three bartenders to reduce the time to get your refreshments. Remember though that we are limited to a maximum of 200 and like our Christmas luncheon we may have another waiting list. So don't delay too long in purchasing your tickets.

On average our branch loses 25 members each year. In January we lost 9 members and didn't install any new ones. In February we lost 1 member and installed 4. At our March luncheon we expect to install 2 new members but have lost an additional 7 more. Thus, our active membership for the year to date is down by 11 to 211. This means in

order for us to meet the SIR State goal of +1 over yearend 2015 (i.e., 223) we need 12 more new members.

My sincere thanks to the sponsors that have encouraged others to join. With a median age of 77 years old (105 members 77 or older) we need new members to keep our branch healthy and viable. Don't forget - members with guests at their table get to eat first - the entire table - after the head table. So, if you have more than one guest at your table you might want to work a 'deal' with another table!
