Due to attending the SIR Town Hall Meeting (the "Meeting") in Walnut Creek on February 12, 2019, I was unable to attend our regularly scheduled monthly luncheon. As a result, I wish to express my sincere appreciation to Dick Aberle for ably filling in for me at this time. It was then that Steven Holt #209 was officially inducted into our organization and it is anticipated that we will be inducting four new members into our branch during the March luncheon. Correctional Lieutenant Ricardo Jauregui was our guest speaker in February from which the content of his presentation was of broad interest to those members in attendance. Based upon his observations of our branch, he was immensely impressed with our mission. He has promised to avail himself to make additional appearances as our situation dictates. At our upcoming March luncheon, Kristi Conforti, the new CEO of the Sonora Senior Center, will be our guest speaker and she will to discuss the immediate challenges and concerns that confront her organization.

I wish to share a few of the highlights relating to the Meeting mentioned above. Mr. Ed Benson, our Sir State President, conducted the Meeting. It is my belief that attendance by all Big Sir and all Little Sir should be made mandatory. There remains a two-fold justification for this belief: first, there is the opportunity to meet other branch members that share a common interest; secondly, is the exposure to a tremendous amount of information that is compressed in less than one full day to digest. One of the focal points repeated during the Meeting were the four pillar functions expected from each member: (1) to be kind and sociable, (2) to participate, (3) to volunteer and (4) bring guests to the luncheon. The idea for establishing a "Best Branch in SIR" award, to be presented at future annual meetings in recognition of branch excellence, was suggested. Spousal activities were discussed at some length as well. There was discussion for the possibility of establishing a central source apparel purchasing outlet that could possess the following advantages: help maintain price stability, quality control and to insure proper return and refund policies. Feedback from annual member surveys can be an important tool in determining which activities best serve the branch's interest and ultimately attract additional membership. For tax reporting purpose, the SIR organization is classified as a 501(c)4 entity. The Policies and Procedures Manual will be available online by March 1, 2019. Donations totaling in excess of \$38,500 were contributed on behalf of the entire Sir state-wide organization to benefit the victims of the Camp Fire. The new SIR logo can contain either of the following mottos: "activities for men" or "social activities for men."



Sons In Retirement A SIR Primer April 23, 1998 Revised May 31, 2001

When I first became involved with Sons In Retirement administration as Branch Secretary I was never quite sure how to refer to either my fellow members or the organization in my written documents. I have not been able to find a good "guide" for this but have found little snippets of information here and there and will put them all together for your information.

"SIR" stands for "Sons In Retirement, Incorporated." Note that there are no periods. S.I.R. stands for a gay rights group in San Francisco and they do not want to be confused with us.

SIR can never be plural as there is only one "Sons In Retirement, Incorporated" even though "Sons" is plural. That is why we write "Sir" when referring to a member and not SIR as it makes no sense, in my opinion, to say he is a "Sons In Retirement, Incorporated."

The possessive would be: I gave the SIR's Manual to John.

A single member reference is the most difficult for me. "John is a member of SIR" seems OK to me but "John is a SIR" meaning "John is a Sons In Retirement" is very awkward (probably because of the plural "Sons"). I suggest we say "John is a Sir." What this means is that "a member of SIR" is a "Sir."

A group of members would be: "Many Sirs gave their SIR's manuals to their Big Sirs."

"Sir" is also used as a courtesy title and serves to recognize the individual as a member of SIR. As an example: Sir Dwight Sale wrote this Primer.

Combined: SIR's activities include outings with many Branches of SIR having picnics to which Sirs' wives attend. At one picnic a Sir's brother came as a guest. Sir Dwight Sale furnished this information.

If you agree with this Primer, great. If you don't agree, then let me know your suggestions/ideas. This Primer@ has no official sanction and I promise to never bring it up as a rule change.
