For those who do not know what this format is here is an explanation: Holes #1 thru #6 - These holes will be played in a **best ball** format for the team. Both players will tee off and play their own ball until holed out. Record each player's score on the player's line and record the best net ball as the team's score on the team line. Handicaps for each player are indicated for each hole. Holes #7 thru #12 - These holes will be played in a *scramble* format. Both players tee off on each hole, select one shot and each player plays from that point until holed out. Each player must use a minimum of two drives from hole #7 thru #12. Record the team's best net score for each hole on the team line. Holes #13 thru #18 - These holes will be played in an alternate shot format. Record the score on the team line. Handicap for holes #13 - #18 are shown on top. Subtract this handicap to determine the team's net total score.
