Wow, time is just flying by, we are almost half way through 2019. I want to take this opportunity to thank those members that helped man our booth at the Home & Garden Show last month. We were able to talk to several potential members and gave out membership applications. We did receive applications from Bill Vaughan and Fred (Slim) Soules. We are down to 211 members currently. We lost 14 members last month due to normal attrition. We must continue to invite guests to our luncheons. Last month I gave out \$5.00 to members that had a filled in "What Do We Do" cards. I was pleased at how many had the card in their wallets. Although some looked old and weathered. They don't do any good staying in your wallet. Get aggressive and hand them out to everyone you meet that might become a member. Remember, new members don't have to be retired to join any more. If a gentleman can attend a 3-hour luncheon once a month he can join us. We do have an attendance requirement of 4 luncheons in 12 months. The three special luncheons do not count towards attendance, thus 4 in 9 equals 44% minimum. The BEC has established a set of rules and exceptions to attendance. There are exceptions for members who cannot meet the minimum attendance requirements: 1) They live in our area only part time; 2) Health reasons; and 3) Family situations that require member to be absent from the minimum luncheons. All reasons must be submitted to the BEC for consideration and approval. Please remember to call the "Membership Message Line" 536-6311 no later than the Sunday before the luncheon meeting.

Our next event is our annual Lady's Day Luncheon. We have sold 186 tickets to date and it looks like another great time to celebrate our wonderful ladies. Without them where would we be?
