In March of this year, we had the start of the COVID-19 Pandemic; to combat the spread of this horrible disease, the country was shut down, massive unemployment followed, and a crash in the stock market sent economic indicators spiraling. Then on May 25, George Floyd was killed by a Minneapolis Police Officer. On July 13, the Black Lives Matter ("BLM) movement was founded.

BLM had demonstrations throughout the country in almost all major cities. The New York Times referred to the movement as "Black Lives Matter Movement May Be the Largest Movement in US History." In August, wildfires began to occur across California. Statewide, there are currently more than 560 active fires that have forced more than 100,000 Californians to evacuate their homes. There have been more than 12,000 lightning strikes. Since August 15, CAL FIRE says more than than 771,000 acres have burned (that's about the size of Rhode Island).
