# The 7th National Corvette Caravan August 21.31, 2024

Often referred to as the world's largest moving automotive event the National Corvette Caravan is a celebration of Americas Sports Car, culminating in Bowling Green, Kentucky for the Anniversary Celebration of the National Corvette Museum. Hosted only once every five years, the latest event took place Labor Day Weekend 2024 and marked the Museums 30th Anniversary

My section of the Caravan covered Northern CA and Northern NV. The official Launch was at Abel Chevrolet on Aug. 21st – while many of you were enjoying the Picnic. Our first stop was in Reno, with a dinner at the National Automobile Museum. We picked up a large group of NV cars and 100 Corvettes headed for our second stop in Wendover, where we toured the Historic Wendover Airfield. The next day took us to Jackson, WY. A freak thunder/hail storm spoiled the dinner cruise we were suppose



to have in Grand Teton. The next day we toured Yellowstone before heading to dinner at the Buffalo Bill Museum in Cody, linking up with the Pacific Northwest section, that had 230 Corvettes. Day 5 took us to Cheyenne with a group dinner in the Little America Ballroom nearly 700 people.

We then headed to Lincoln, NE, with a dinner in the Historic Haymarket District. The morning of day 7 started with a private tour of the three floors of the Museum of American Speed, before heading to our final night in Columbia, MO, enjoying a BBQ and ZOOM presentation by Josh Holder, Corvette Chief Engineer on the giant screen.

Day 8 of our drive brought us into Bowling Green, KY, joining an estimated 6,000+ Corvettes who had come from various parts of the U.S.

The next three days were the Anniversary Celebration of

the Grand Opening of the national Corvette Museum, with multiple events, seminars, and various vendors on-site. Some people were able to sign up for a limited number of Corvette Factory Tours, and/or take their Corvette on spirited lead-follow laps on the nearby Motorsports Park track.

My responsibilities as Caravan Captain ended upon our arrival in Bowling Green, as there were no organized return groups. Many chose to take advantage of being so far East, to visit friends/relatives, and/or various sites/attractions on the East Coast. I joined another of our group who needed to return quickly, getting back to CA to publish this Bulletin.

Here is how to get it:




